With a 70+ member club, communication is key! It is critical to find efficient and effective means to reach out to all our members and ensure that they are informed and feel included in all the activities of the club - and feel valued as members through such communication. The ability to communicate with the public and the community is also important. The Communication Committee worked hard to reach out in many ways throughout the club year.

<u>Club Newsletter</u>: Altrusa Tidings is published regularly in electronic format and contains a wealth of information about club activities - past, present, and future. Email notifications were sent to members and others when each issue was published and available on the club website (www.altrusarichardson.com). The newsletter is a great marketing tool as members can simply direct guests, community supporters, and potential members to review our newsletters to see what we are all about.

<u>Club Website</u>: We continue to use a non-profit on-line membership management software (Wild Apricot) to help facilitate communication with members and the general public — it is a great tool with useful features that help enhance the productivity and efficiency of our club! The club website (www.altrusarichardson.com) contains valuable information for both the general public and potential members; it is a valuable interactive tool for club members as well. Each service committee has their own webpage showcasing their activities and projects.


- Club Members can log into the website for access to "member-only" information, for example: view the on-line membership directory; pay dues and invoices (via AffiniPay); review club minutes, agendas, budgets, treasurer reports, and committee lists and so much more; and view and register for upcoming club events and activities. Club forms are easily accessible along with a wealth of District and International information and links. To view the "Member Only Information", we encourage you to sign in as an "Altrusa Guest". (see attached Website material tab for Username and Password)
- Our major fundraiser, "Outstanding Women of Today" (OWT) Annual Awards Luncheon, has its own webpage, however, due to the pandemic we were unable to conduct our popular fundraiser in 2020. Therefore, we got creative and utilized our website's "online store" feature to promote our "Shamrockin' Photo Contest" with great success! The public and members were able to submit photos online for a fee to join the contest. Once all photos were received, the voting began using the "online store" for supporters to "vote" for photos by making a \$5 purchase per vote. This fundraiser lasted only 3 days, but we raised over \$4,800. Our website made this super easy and super fun!

Emails: Through the website, the majority of club communications can be automated. Emails are automatically sent through the website software so event announcement emails can be delivered several days prior to an event, a reminder can be sent a few day before the event, and members who registered on-line for an event are sent a final reminder email the day before the event. Email management is no longer an administrative nightmare. Protocol is set up in the software in advance and emails are automated from that point forward. What a time saver! Emails are used to inform members of upcoming and recent events as well as volunteer opportunities and membership updates. It is a great way to reach out to our members and help them feel connected (see attached examples).

<u>Publicity</u>: Most years, our publicity is mainly focused on "Outstanding Women of Today" (OWT), our annual fundraiser; however, this year, we achieved recognition for our Big Check presentation to the City Council in December 2020 and invitation to high school seniors to submit Scholarship Applications, which opened in January 2021. All this helps achieve name recognition for Altrusa in many ways!

Other: Altrusa Richardson has been recognized and publicized in a variety of new ways, the most prominent in 2020 was the Richardson Strong sign campaign. Also notable is City's Animal Shelter Cat Adoption room complete with our name on the wall mural and paddock sponsorship at the Barkway Dog Park. We continue to use our "big check" and banners for great photos ops. We sponsored a Telehealth Room. We readily have business cards and brochures available. Through various community support outlets, we continue to receive recognition and publicity to help Altrusa be more widely recognizable (see attached examples).

ALTRUSA INTERNATIONAL/DISTRICT NINE SERVICE PROJECT Invitation to Serve your Club and your Community

This past year our club had planned to hold a Days for Girls District Nine service project at Conference in April but due to the pandemic the Conference was cancelled, which delayed this project. Over the summer the supplies pledged to this project have been collected from District clubs and on August 8th a workday to assemble kits was held. Following COVID-19 safety guidelines volunteers were limited. Jane Tucker and Garland club members Mary Powlen, Elizabeth Fuentes, and Christina Contreras met at the home of District Nine First Vice Governor Shirley Raymer to assemble 134 kits. Beverly Lenoir dropped off 60 assembled kits from the Collin County club.

The Rowlett Days for Girls Team had alerted our members that there was an immediate alert calling for all Days for Girls Chapters and Teams to come together to support the DfG Lebanon Enterprises. The August 4th, 2020 massive explosion in Beirut which had killed more than 150, injured over 5,000 and dis-

placed over 300,000 has created an overwhelming task for the DfG Lebanon Enterprises trying to provide emergency menstrual supplies to not only refugees but also the women and girls affected by this disaster. Because of this crisis, the 194 kits assembled were mailed to a collection point in Liberty, Missouri for shipment to Beirut.

Future workdays during the fall are planned until all the kits have been assembled. Hopefully, a total of 500 will be completed and distributed to areas in need of Days for Girls kits.

Altrusa Richardson Assists Days for Girls Turn Periods Into Pathways

For three years our Club has been working with Days for Girls to assemble kits for distribution in Africa and Bogota, Columbia. The assembled kits containing shields, liners, panties, a washcloth, soap, transport bag, menstrual chart, and drawstring bag have allowed hundreds of women and girls to manage their menstruation with dignity and help shatter the stigma and limitations associated with menstruation.

Another area of Days for Girls has emerged. Starting in 2012, a small team of leaders Uganda began the mission of developing the goal of Days for Girls into a sustainable, locally oriented business model allowing women and girls the opportunity to make and sell the kits for themselves. It took a year of program design, planning, and evaluation to officially launch the Days for Girls Enterprise in 2013. More than ever before, due to the pandemic the world is in upheaval and Days for Girls kits are in high demand. During the first quarter of 2020, Days for Girls African Enterprises were able to provide employment opportunities for women in sub-Saharan Africa. In March, Enterprise leaders in sixteen countries met in Kenya and Uganda with a team from Days for Girls International. These leaders were instructed on ways to improve their businesses which included branding, marketing, reporting, time management, budgeting, and goal setting. They also received information about improvements to the Ambassador of Women's Health and Men Who Know curriculums. The leaders also met with and received support from government officials in Kenya and went to schools to provide menstrual education and DfG kits. Even with the recent COVID-19 pandemic crisis the Days for Girls African Enterprises have continued to provide menstrual supplies and education to women and girls. They have even started making masks for local healthcare workers and those individuals most vulnerable to spread the virus.

More than even before, these women and girls in Africa are needing our help to keep up the work that is going on there. To assist in this effort our club has donated items to help the Days for Girls Enterprise in Kumpala, Uganda. Through an Altrusa International Days for Girls grant our club has been able to not only help with purchasing and helping to prepare almost 500 kits for our 2020 District Service Project but through our workshop sessions held in January and February 2020 have also able to cut extra shields and transfer bags which our club has donated to the Highland Village Days for Girls Team. They plan to send the supplies to the Kumpala Enterprise which will allow them to sew over 200 shields and transfer bags. To quote Celeste Mergens, Founder and CEO of Days for Girls, "Periods don't pause for pandemics" so we need to continue supporting the effort of helping every girl, everywhere, period.

International Literacy Day, September 8, 2020: International Literacy Day 2020 focuses on "Literacy teaching and learning in the COVID-19 crisis and beyond," especially on the role of educators and changing pedagogies

The Kindness Committee has been busy this summer with getting our plans for the 2020-2021 fiscal year started. We have made or will make monetary donations to the following charities:

- \$432 to TeacHaiti that helps with the education of Willnise Pierre Louis, a little girl going into the 5^{th} grade
- \$500 to HELPS International where we are supporting the education of Senayda Isabela Torres Medina who will be in the seventh grade this school year

- \$200 of our budget is going to Think Kindness/VIMA Ghana, a new charity we chose to support because it is an orphanage in Ghana where we donated a Choose Kind Library in 2019. They are in need of educational supplies as well as cleaning and sanitizing supplies due to the COVID-19 virus.
- \$350 is going to support Mike's Kids (through Southwest Good Samaritan Ministries) which helps a non-profit feed and clothe the poorest in the Rio Grande Valley. We also have a Choose Kind Library at the El Puente Orphanage in Matemores. Mike's Kids was founded by our Altrusa President

Samanthia Slaight's late husband.

Our "hands-on" project for the first half of this year is to send boxes of desired items to our military in the Middle East. We are working with three chaplains to distribute the items as they see fit. Sue McElveen has been hard at work finding the best deals on items like baby wipes, razors, jerky, and coffee packets. The plan is to send several boxes of goodies at a time to a chaplain over the remaining months in 2020. We will rotate through the committee roster so that only 2 members at a time are preparing and shipping the boxes.

Another project we have begun to plan is to purchase, package, and donate feminine hygiene items to New Friends New Life (NFNL) which is a 501 (c) (3) organization located in the Dallas-Fort Worth area dedicated to restor-

ing and empowering formerly trafficked girls and sexually exploited women and their children. This project will be done during the first half of 2021.







Altrusa Richardson Grant for "Days for Girls" Follow-up Report (Excerpt)

"This grant allowed for a unique endeavor by all of District Nine to promote our "Defying Gravity 2.0" theme and unite Texas with this Days for Girls Service Project, allowing our District an avenue to develop leadership skills and promote inclusion of all District Nine clubs. As host club for our 2020 District Nine Conference, the Richardson club was shouldered with providing the necessary supplies to complete this District project. Over 20 of the 35 clubs in district Nine participated in this project. Hours of purchasing supplies, cutting, sewing and assembly were done by Altrusa members all over District Nine. Days for Girls Teams were also involved in sewing kit components and helping with distribution. Our vision for this project was to have all the District Nine clubs become aware of how Days for Girls can reach out and help women and girls all over the world and what contribution, no matter how small, can lead to the monumental result of "turning periods into pathways".

The project can be evaluated by viewing the effectiveness of having all of District Nine involved in the project. This project not only reached our goal of 400 kits but surpassed it with a final count of 700 kits. One

hundred kits are going to a women's correctional facility in Freetown, Sierra Leone. A total of eight cases containing 194 kits were shipped to Beirut, Lebanon to comply with an urgent request from Days for girls Lebanon Enterprises to help meet the tremendous needs due to the Port explosion disaster. 95 kits are going to Fundacion Familia Maya, in Guatemala. 198 kits will be distributed by high school counselors to students in lewisvill and Highland village, Texas, who are helping a large immigrant population from Burma, and 113 kits are still to be distributed. ... An estimated 200 kits can be assembled from extra kit components not needed to complete our project, that

have been donated to the Uganda Days for Girls Enterprise in Kumpala, Uganda. The mission of this Enterprise is to develop a sustainable Days for Girls business model to allow women and girls the opportunity to make and sell the kits for themselves.

- Ordered 2000 DfG Kits and 3500 masks from the DfG Lebanon Enterprises run by Syrian Refugees for the emergency response
- Tollected 27,755 DfG Kits from 186 Chapters and Teams:
 - 12,565 Kits have been shipped to Lebanon for emergency and humanitarian response led by DfG Lebanon
 - 5,880 Kits have been shipped to Honduras for COVID-19 response
 - 9,310 Kits have been shipped to Americares. They are assessing the needs of their incountry partners and will be selecting the locations most in need to receive these Kits.

Together, we are bringing comfort and dignity to 29,755 women and girls during this challenging time.

Community Outreach Donation to Ark House

On October 16, 2020, Community Outreach members Mary Boyter and Gloria Sandoval presented sixteen sets of twin bed sheets to Ark House representative Betsy Meggs; also, there to welcome Betsy were Altrusans Marsha Peterson and Courtenay Tanner. Betsy stated that the bed sheets are desperately needed because, unfortunately, sometimes items belonging to Ark House seem to disappear.

The Mission of Ark House is to provide low cost temporary housing for out of town patients and their families while undergoing extended medical treatment in the Dallas area.

Patients are referred from Baylor, Medical City, UT Southwestern, Children's Hospital, Parkland Burn Center and other hospitals in Dallas. They are referred through the hospital's social worker who has identified their need, to secure affordable, temporary housing in the Dallas area while receiving extensive medical treatment. Most Ark House patients are from small towns all over Texas, including Dallas County. However, some patients may come from as far away as South America. Having a safe, clean, comfortable and most importantly affordable place to stay for sometimes months of treatment is critical to the healing process.

The project consists of sixteen apartments conveniently located to the major Dallas hospitals. These fully furnished, one-bedroom apartments that sleep four are leased by Ark House and made available to out of town patients at a charge of \$25 per day. This charge constitutes less than ½ of the cost to provide the housing, utilities, telephone and cable. Their homey atmosphere is conducive to the healing process.


The Alzheimer's Association is grateful for our support. This project truly reflects how we can achieve "wonderful things through Unity, Teamwork, and Compassion".

The committee's plan was to mail out six boxes per month to various sites in order to observe the COVID-19 provisions. Sue and Linda, co-chairs of the committee, sent out six boxes in August to Kuwait.

In early September, Sue had Janie Jaquier and Cindy McIntyre at her home to fill the next six boxes, which were mailed to Kuwait. In early October, Linda, Sarah Saunders, and Ann Turner met at Linda's house to pack six boxes that were sent to a base in Japan where Marines and Sailors are in "Restriction of Movement" due to COVID-19. Nancy Rohm and Pam Johnson sent out another six boxes to the base in Japan. In November, Jane Tucker, and Robbin Murley sent out six boxes to Kuwait to Chaplain Spivey. Chaplain Spivey was the instigator of the donation we received to fund this project.

2020 U.N. Days and Observances

International Day for the Abolition of Slavery December 2, 2020: According to the <u>ILO</u> more than 40 million people worldwide are victims of modern slavery. Although modern slavery is not defined in law, it is used as an umbrella term covering practices such as forced labor, debt bondage, forced marriage, and human trafficking. Essentially, it refers to situations of exploitation that a person cannot refuse or leave because of threats, violence, coercion, deception, and/or abuse of power.


Human Rights Day, December 10, 2020: This year's Human Rights Day theme relates to the COVID-19 pandemic and focuses on the need to build back better by ensuring Human Rights are central to recovery efforts. We will reach our common global goals only if we are able to create equal opportunities for all, address the failures exposed and exploited by COVID-19, and apply human rights standards to tackle entrenched, systematic, and intergenerational inequalities, exclusion and discrimination.

International Day of Education, January 24, 2021: The right to education is enshrined in article 26 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. The declaration calls for free and compulsory elementary education. The Convention on the Rights of the Child, adopted in 1989, goes further to stipulate that countries shall make higher education accessible to all.

When it adopted the <u>2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development</u> in September 2015, the international community recognized that education is essential for the success of all 17 of its goals. <u>Sustainable Development Goal 4</u>, in particular, aims to "ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all" by 2030.

World Day of Social Justice, February 20, 2021: Social justice is an underlying principle for peaceful and prosperous coexistence within and among nations. We uphold the principles of social justice when we promote gender equality, or the rights of indigenous peoples and migrants. We advance social justice when we remove barriers that people face because of gender, age, race, ethnicity, religion, culture or disability.

For the United Nations, the pursuit of social justice for all is at the core of our global mission to promote development and human dignity. The adoption by the International Labour Organization of the Declaration on Social Justice for a Fair Globalization is just one recent example of the UN System's commitment to social justice. The Declaration focuses on guaranteeing fair outcomes for all, through employment, social protection, social dialogue, and fundamental principles and rights at work.





Altrusa at the United Nations

Since 1946, Altrusa International has held observer status at the United Nations (UN). At that time, Altrusa was the first international classified service club for then executive and professional women to have an official observer appointed to the United Nations, Frances K. Marquis, president of the New York City (NYC)Altrusa Club. Frances was a close friend to another active NYC Altrusan, Eleanor Roosevelt. Eleanor Rooselt delivered an address at the 1945 San Francisco UN Conference on International Organization and later then President Harry S. Truman appointed Mrs. Roosevelt to Chair the famous UN Human Rights Committee.

In 1978, our UN membership was assigned to the level of a NGO (Non-Governmental Organization) in roster status within the ECOSOC (the Economic and Social Council). In this capacity, we join together with other NGOs, empowered to attend open General Assembly sessions and UN briefings/conferences related solely to global and social concerns, and receive UN Ground Passes.


In each biennium, the International Board appoint 5 representatives to attend and monitor UN meetings and briefings, as allowed. Altrusa's representatives may participate (either in person or via teleconference/

Facebook) in weekly briefings/"chats" conducted by the UN Department of Global Communication (DGC), Civil Society

(NGOs). In addition, they may serve on DGC Annual Conference committees and other projects, formed to further the improvement of the human condition worldwide.






Call to International Convention








Altrusa Richardson's BIG Check




ALTRUSA INTERNATIONAL, INC. OF RICHARDSON, TEXAS






