Café Momentum Supports At-Risk Youth

Several months ago, our president, Sue McElveen, along with her husband Jerry, and a few of their friends, had dinner at Café Momentum. She was very impressed, and being an inquisitive sort, Sue asked several questions about the Café and its mission.

As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit restaurant, Café Momentum teaches critical skills that allow youth to apply what they have been taught in pre-release programs in a safe, real-world environment of nurturing accountability. By participating in our program, at-risk young men and women rotate through every aspect of the restaurant from waiting tables to washing dishes, while working side-by-side with established chefs.

Café Momentum, working in collaboration with the Dallas County Juvenile Justice Department, strives to teach young adolescent men and women that it is possible to break the cycle of violence and crime that many of these

teens have faced. They focus on creating environments for these youth where they can gain self-confidence and learn marketable skills to ensure a more successful

to plan the dinner programs for this year, Sue knew that she wanted to include a speaker from the Café who would share the story and purpose.

We were so fortunate that Joshua Boyce, Case Manager, was free to speak to us. Joshua spearheads the mental health component that's now part of the organization's 12-month internship, and provides a host of enrichment programs throughout the summer. Joshua has a Master of Science in Counseling Psychology from Tennessee State University, along with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from The University of Texas at Arlington. He's worked with youthful offenders for the past four years and truly lives in the passion of working with young people across the board!
