ALTRUSA INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION REPORT

Since 1962, the Altrusa International Foundation has demonstrated a strong and enduring commitment to serve communities both here in the United States and abroad. They advance this commitment by supporting local Altrusans in their community efforts to provide for the care and enrichment of those most in need.

Each year the Foundation awards grant funding to Altrusa and ASTRA Clubs, as well as to international agencies; to support healthcare, educational, and economic development initiatives that impact thousands of children and other under-resourced communities. Moreover, through the disaster relief aid program, they provide timely response and financial support to communities affected by natural disasters and other devastating crises.

- <u>Foundation Grants</u>: The Foundation provides assistance to individuals and helps Altrusa Clubs carry out the independent programs of community service with funds for vocational assistance; graduate school assistance to international students from developing countries; literacy projects; and community service projects sponsored by local Altrusa Clubs.
- <u>Scholarships</u>: The Altrusa scholarship is designed to help students who are passionate about giving back to their communities. The scholarship is worth up to \$10,000 and is open to students who are currently enrolled in an accredited college or university. Students who are interested in applying for the scholarship must submit an essay detailing their community service experience and how they plan to use their education to give back to their community.
- <u>Club 21 Grants</u>: Established in 1997, the Club 21 Program is committed to supporting programs for children affected by disease and disabilities; as well as international healthcare curriculum. As members of Club 21, you are given an opportunity to extend a hand to these children and families.
- <u>Disaster Relief Aid</u>: Funds designated to Disaster Relief Aid assist the Foundation's efforts to provide timely response to district-specific disasters. It also may go to relief agencies to enhance overall first responders' efforts.
- <u>Endowment Fund</u>: Established in 1992, designed to be the legacy for the future and the chief source of income for all charitable activities of the Foundation.

Through the generous financial support of Altrusans, the Altrusa International Foundation awarded over \$780,000 in grants, scholarships, awards and relief aid during the 2021-2023 biennium.



Ways to give:

Make a financial donation for any amount to the Altrusa International Foundation, Inc. Funds can be designated to a specific program or not. Funds designated to "Where Most Needed" will support a broad range of the Altrusa International Foundations' operational and programmatic needs.

Club 21 donation: Make a financial donation of \$21 annually. You receive a Club 21 recognition pin with your first donation. Clubs can also be Club 21 clubs.

Lamplighter, Lucente or Hofmeister giving levels:

Lamplighter: Earned after \$500 donation. You receive a Lamplighter pin and are awarded a diamond for each subsequent \$500 donation (pin holds 24 diamonds)

Lucente: Earned after 10 donations of \$500. You receive a Lucente pin.

Hofmeister: Earned after 25 donations of \$500. You receive a Hofmeister pin which contains diamonds and sapphires.

Legacy Giving: This is a deferred gift.
