
UNITED NATIONS INTERNATIONAL FRIENDSHIP DAY EVENT

Amidst the turmoil in Haiti, we are grateful to share that Teach Haiti has experienced a month filled with celebration. We proudly witnessed two kindergarten graduations, one in St. Michel and another in Port-au-Prince. Additionally, we are thrilled to share the news that Teach Haiti has successfully graduated its second class of seniors. These 27 students have accomplished something that very few in Haiti are fortunate enough to claim. We must acknowledge the crucial role played by steadfast supporters *like you*, who have paved the way for the success. Thanks to the support of sponsors, these students have big dreams and an opportunity to break free from the cycle of poverty.
